

ESSER Home Visit Project:

Info by the Numbers

From January 2023 to September 2024, fourteen LEAs were accepted into the ESSER Home Visit Project grant with the USBE. Of these, thirteen remained active during the grant cycle. LEA professionals attended ongoing training and conducted home visits to strengthen the home-school partnership. In total, **61** school sites were involved.

6,559Home Visits were Conducted

8,868Students were Impacted

1,195Total Trained Home Visitors

Home visits are a proactive strategy where school professionals visit students' homes to build relationships. Using an evidence-based approach like the Parent Teacher Home Visit (PTHV) model has been shown to:



Strengthen the home-school connection

Increase parent engagement with their LEA

Lead to higher student attendance

Improve academic performance

Enhance teacher satisfaction

These home visits help LEAs, community partners, and state agencies gather input from families and better understand families' current needs.
