Supporting Students with Disabilities

Education for students with disabilities is protected under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act. Below are some helpful resources to help families navigate the ststem.

Utah's Child Nutrition Programs help make sure students have access to healthy meals at school, during summer, and in afterschool settings.

These programs support learning and wellness by offering breakfast, lunch, snacks, and even fresh local foods. Families may qualify for free or reduced-price meals based on income, and applications are available through your child's school or district.

2025 Legislative Updates for Families

Each year, new state laws may impact families, students, and public schools. Here are some recent legislative changes from the 2025 session that may be helpful to know:

Attendance <u>"Every Day Counts" Attendance Campaign 2025</u>

- Defines valid absences: 53G-6-201
- Guidelines for approved absences: <u>53G-6-205</u>

Homeschooling

HB 209: Removes aff idavit requirement or homeschooling

Health & Consent

• <u>HB 281</u>: Requires parental consent for school-based mental health services

Sex Education

HB 566: Expands parental input in sex education decisions

School Safety

• <u>HB 40</u> / <u>SB 170</u>: Establish new standards for physical security, threat response, and, communication with f amilies through notif ication. This includes security upgrades with video, alarms, locks etc.
