

Comprehensive Parent Engagement Plan for School Leaders

Goal: Create a **systemic, collaborative, and culturally responsive** approach to family engagement, rooted in research and aligned with the *Dual Capacity-Building Framework*. (Mapp & Kuttner, 2014)

I. Why - The Importance of Parent Engagement

Research-based Benefits:

- Improved student achievement (higher test scores, grades, graduation rates) (Mapp, K. L., & Kuttner, P. J., 2014 *Partners in Education*. U.S. Department of Education.)
- Reduced absenteeism and disciplinary issues (U.S. Department of Education, *Chronic Absenteeism in the Nation's Schools*.)
- Increased teacher morale and job satisfaction
- Stronger school-community relationships (Harvard Family Research Project.)

II. Guiding Principles (Based on Mapp & Kuttner's Dual Capacity-Building Framework)

- **Shared Responsibility:** Schools and families are partners in student success. Everyone contributes!
- **Two-Way Communication:** Open and continuous dialogue between school and home.
- **Respect for Diversity:** Honor all cultural, linguistic, and socioeconomic backgrounds.
- **Active Parent Involvement:** Provide opportunities for parents to participate in school decision-making and activities.
- **Building Trust:** Establish relationships based on mutual respect and understanding.
- **Student Voice and Agency:** Students are active partners in their educational journey, and their perspectives are essential for designing and evaluating effective family engagement practices.

III. Key Components

A. Leadership and Vision

- **Principal as Champion:** The principal must be a strong advocate for parent engagement and model effective practices.
- **School-Wide Commitment:** Embed parent engagement in the school's mission, vision, and improvement plans.
- **Parent Engagement Coordinator:** Designate a staff member to lead and coordinate parent engagement efforts.
- **Parent Leadership Teams:** Establish parent advisory groups to provide input and feedback on school policies and programs.

B. Communication and Outreach

- **Multiple Channels:** Utilize a variety of communication tools to reach all families (e.g., digital platforms, email, text messaging, phone calls, translated materials).
- **Regular Updates:** Provide frequent and informative communication about school events, student progress, and learning activities.
- **Welcoming Environment:** Create a school climate that is inclusive and inviting to all families.
- **Culturally Responsive Communication:** Use communication strategies that are sensitive to language and cultural differences.
- **Operationalizing "Welcoming Environment":** Expand with actionable strategies to affirm and welcome diverse family structures, foster, single-parent, and multigenerational households. This includes auditing school forms for inclusive language (e.g., using "Family" or "Guardian" instead of only "Mother/Father") and re-evaluating traditional school events to be inclusive of all loved ones.
- **Digital Equity Strategy:** Create and implement a digital equity plan. This involves conducting regular needs assessments to understand family access to reliable internet and devices, and providing targeted support to overcome barriers like cost, availability, or digital literacy.

C. Learning at Home

- **Workshops and Training:** Offer workshops for parents on topics such as supporting learning at home, homework help, and digital literacy.
- **Resources and Materials:** Provide access to books, online resources, and other materials that can help families support their children's learning.
- **Family Literacy Programs:** Implement programs that promote literacy development for both parents and children.

D. School Decision-Making and Advocacy

- **Parent-Teacher Organizations (PTOs/PTAs):** Strengthen PTOs/PTAs to provide a platform for parent voice and leadership.
- **School Site Councils:** Ensure parent representation on school site councils and other decision-making bodies.
- **Parent Advocacy Training:** Empower parents to advocate for their children's education.
- **Student Representation:** Creative formal roles for student participation, such as including student representatives on school councils and parent leadership teams to ensure their perspectives are integrated into school governance.

E. Collaborating with the Community

- **Community Partnerships:** Build relationships with community organizations to provide resources and support to families.
- **Volunteer Opportunities:** Create opportunities for parents and community members to volunteer in the school.
- **Family Resource Centers:** Establish or partner with family resource centers to provide comprehensive support services to families.

IV. Professional Development

- **Ongoing Training:** Provide regular professional development for all staff on effective parent engagement strategies.
- **Cultural Competency Training:** Equip staff with the knowledge and skills to work effectively with diverse families.
- **Collaborative Practices:** Promote collaborative practices between teachers and parents, such as joint goal setting and shared decision-making.
- **Data-Driven Decision Making:** Use data to monitor parent engagement efforts and make adjustments as needed.
- **Training in Conflict Resolution:** Focused on preparing staff for difficult conversations. Equip staff with evidence-based frameworks for managing disagreements and discussing sensitive topics (e.g., academic struggles, behavioral issues) in a way that preserves trust.

V. Evaluation and Continuous Improvement

- **Data Collection:** Gather data on parent participation, satisfaction, and impact on student outcomes.
- **Feedback Mechanisms:** Solicit feedback from parents and staff on the effectiveness of parent engagement initiatives.

- **Plan Adjustments:** Regularly review and revise the parent engagement plan based on data and feedback.
- ***Celebrate and Message:*** *Celebrate and message your successes.*

VI. Partnering for Student Well-being

- **Alignment with Mental Health Supports:** Integrate family engagement strategies with school-wide mental health and wellness initiatives, such as Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS).
- **Co-Creating a Supportive Environment:** Work with families to build a seamless network of support for students' preventative services, ensuring consistency between home and school.

VII. Funding and Sustainability

- **Strategic Budgeting:** Dedicate ongoing budgets for family engagements for key expenses such as a Parent Engagement Coordinator, translation and interpretation services, childcare for meetings, and professional development.
- **Leveraging Federal and State Funding:** Utilize funding streams for family engagement activities and provide examples of allowable costs.
