


Growth and the WPU

Enrollment Growth and WPU



\$252,086,500 ongoing & \$4,680,900 one-time. This funding includes the WPU value increase. LEAs will be funded on the prior year ADM + growth. Enrollment growth was funded for an estimated increase of 7,902 students next year.


Growth and the WPU



Voted and Board Local Levy Programs Increase

The Equity Pupil Tax Rate could increase the number of guaranteed local levy increments up to 20 for either the Voted or Board Local Levy Programs with appropriated funds of \$70 million.





Early Learning Programs

Enhanced Kindergarten Amendments

HB99: Representative V. Lowry Snow & Senator Lyle Hillyard



Received \$10 Million ongoing to increase access to Optional Enhanced Kindergarten (OEK) for students.

Combined with the \$7.5 million ongoing currently appropriated for the enhanced kindergarten early intervention program, this funding will enable early intervention for about 25% of students starting school unprepared for kindergarten.

Early Learning Training and Assessments

HB114: Representative Steve Waldrip & Senator Ann Millner



To provide targeted professional learning and ongoing, jobembedded coaching to support preschool through grade three teachers in their instructional practice and to improve student outcomes in literacy and mathematics.

To establish a science of reading assessment for teacher candidates to ensure basic foundational knowledge of teaching reading.

SJR 9: Senator Daniel McCay & Representative Mike Schultz

Allows use of income tax revenue to support services for children and individuals with disabilities.

Protects public education funding.

Auto-Adjusts education funding for enrollment growth and inflation.


Reserves above-trend revenues to meet Ed. funding during economic downturns.

LAUNCH Certificate

6 CE credits in any subject

DISCOVER Certificate

15 CE credits, 3 credits in each of the following: Arts, Humanities, Life sciences, Social/Behavior Sciences, Physical Sciences

TRANSFORM Certificate

Completing requirements outlined by the State Board of Regents

TRANSFORM CTE Credential

Completes a CTE program that is at least 900 hrs. or 30 credits



HB 242 Charter School Operations and Schools Accounting Amendments

SB 94 Reporting Requirements Amendments

HB 242: Charter School Operations and Schools Accounting Amendments

- Requires use of Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Accounting Standards
- New charter schools must begin as a provisional charter for 3-5 years. Authorizer may then allow the charter to become "evergreen" after that time/discretion
- Permits an authorizer to:
 - request a court to appoint a neutral receiver in the event of a closure
 - transfer students from a closing charter to another charter
 - request financial documents from its charter schools
- Documents of a third-party provider working for a charter are property of the school




