Annual LEA Determinations

Entry and Exit Scores


Teachers rate students' skills at entry and exit in the 3 outcome areas, using a 7-point scale. These scores are entered on the UPOD platform:

- 1. Positive social-emotional skills
- 2. Acquisition and use of knowledge and skills
- 3. Use of appropriate behaviors to meet their needs

Categories

Entry and exit scores, along with whether the student made progress, are used to sort students into categories:

- a. Did not improve functioning
- b. Improved functioning, no change in trajectory
- c. Moved closer to functioning like sameaged peers
- d. Improved functioning to that of sameaged peers
- e. Functioning like same-aged peers



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Summary Statement 1 data for all three categories are used in the Annual LEA Determinations. Scores are based on the distance of the LEA data from the state targets.

Summary Statements

Category scores are input into mathematical formulas to determine each of the 3 outcome areas:

Summary Statement 1: Growth
Of those students who entered the
program below age expectations, the
percent who substantially increased their
rate of growth by the time they exited
the program. The formula is the sum of
students in categories c and d, divided by
the sum of students in categories a, b, c,
and d.

Summary Statement 2: Proficiency
The percent of students who were
functioning within age expectations by
the time they exited the program. The
formula is the sum of students in
categories d and e, divided by the sum of
all students (categories a, b, c, d, and e).



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
